How to Worship

The Psalms constitute a blue print to follow for worship. They identify the themes for worship as well as address the obstacles and hindrances to spiritual praise. They teach us to pray whether in confessing our sins, praying our way out of trouble or depression, or praising the Lord for His perfections and works. The Psalms set a divinely inspired standard for worship. Although they deal with the issue of personal experience and testimony, predominantly they set forth essential objective truths of doctrine and the gospel. If there is any surface lesson from the Psalms, it is that worship is all about God and not about man. The Psalms reveal a theology of worship. So come and let us learn to worship the Lord as He prescribes.
